THE WORD

The gift of options and choices can be both a blessing and a curse. How does one know the right door? How does one decide? Today’s Gospel admonishes us to enter through the narrow one, yet what does that mean? Is it the least attractive? The most difficult? The one without any fun on the other side? The one no one else chooses? The one that sets us apart? Which is the narrow door?

The psychologist Carl Jung posited that each of us has a shadow side to our personality. There are those aspects of who we are that we would prefer to keep in the dark. In part that shadow is a composite of all that we would prefer to not be. It holds angers and greed and instincts for revenge, our laziness and lusts and boastful pride.

Our shadows also hold our failed ideals – the ideal parent or spouse or disciple of Jesus. None of us ever quite measures up, and most of us would rather keep that fact against the back wall of our darkest closet. The doors to such closets are very narrow indeed.

It is, however, only by entering such darknesses and coming to recognize and admit who we truly are that we also come to discover God standing in the midst of our weakest selves. So, advises Jesus, do enter through the narrow door. Don’t back away from your most honest self. Recognize who you are, in the light and in the dark, lest no one recognize you when you knock for entrance into the kingdom.
