THE WORD

Gerard Manley Hopkins' poem "As Kingfishers Catch Fire" is about how each aspect of creation does one thing well. As a kingfisher dives into the water after a fish, it catches the sunlight on its wings and flames bright with magnificence; each bell flings out its own regal sound purely and with majesty; the string on a musical instrument vibrates with beauty in the ear; and finally, "the just man justifies," which is to say that the grace of God in each of us can't help but be flung out through creation, gracing all life and doing good.

The truth of the matter is that the world needs us doing what each of us does so well, be that raising children or crafting with wood or keeping an office running smoothly. It's how life keeps spinning around the sun and how you and I balance the scales, and most importantly how God makes all things new. As Paul took pains to point out to the community in Corinth, "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit" (1 Corinthians 12:4, 7).

These days our drive to nurture and benefit the common good does seem to have withered. It has not yet shriveled into a dusty remnant, but it is a shadow of its former self. Yet every once in a while it does show its face, and when it does, when we begin to offer our gifted selves for the sake of the community, then it is the very face of Christ that looks upon the dream of a new creation. As Hopkins wrote, then each of us "acts in God's eye what in God's eye he is - /Christ - for Christ plays in ten thousand places/....through the features of men's faces."
