Lenten Opportunities at Holy Cross

Ash Wednesday – February 6th: Ashes will be distributed during the 8:00 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. Masses. Day of fast and abstinence*.

Every Friday: Stations of the Cross after 11:30 a.m. Mass. **[Sorrowful Mother Novena will resume on First Fridays after Easter.]** Day of abstinence (no meat for those over 14 years of age).

Bible Study: March 2nd and 9th at 10:00 a.m. (Location will be the Cum Christo Center). Karen Gagel will lead the discussion based on the Sunday readings.

Deanery Reconciliation Service: March 2nd, at 4:00 p.m. (location to be determined).

Holy Thursday: Mass of the Lord’s Supper, 5:30 p.m.

Good Friday: Day of fast and abstinence.
1:00 p.m. Stations of the Cross
2:00 p.m. Good Friday Liturgy and Holy Communion

Holy Saturday: 8:30 p.m. Solemn Easter Vigil

*Fast = One main meal, 2 lesser meals, no food between meals for 21-59 years. Abstinence = no meat for over 14 years old.

This Lent Season

Traditionally, in our Catholic experience of Lent, we are invited to the three privileges and challenges of prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

Prayer – The “Little Black Book” of reflection will be distributed this Sunday (one to a household please).

Fasting – In addition to whatever physical fasting you are able to do, each week we will be considering one of the seven basic principles of Catholic Social Teaching. This is an invitation to the discipline of self-examination, education and action in our everyday lives.

Almsgiving – We will be distributing a Rice Bowl and home calendar to each person. Please use the Rice Bowl for your monetary sacrifices as individuals or as a family and return the Sacrifice Money to be used by the Catholic Relief Services on Palm Sunday. The calendar has added readings and ideas for Lenten enrichment.

Next Sunday, February 10, at the 9:00 a.m. Mass, we will celebrate the Rite of Sending for our catechumens (to be baptized) Rose Scholl, Heather Felton and Chantee Bartoe and our candidate (baptized to be received into full communion with the Church) Tracy Kelly. At this time, we as a parish will send them to the Bishop for the Rite of Election to take place at St. Edward’s in Granville at 6:30 p.m. All the candidates/ catechumens of the diocese will officially be welcomed by the Bishop to enter the final phase of purification and intensive preparation for the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil.
