THE WORD

As so often happens, it is the poets and the storytellers who capture how life truly is. Most of the time it's in the quiet of our own sortings that we hear God speaking, and even more pointedly when we hear God sending, as the Gospel of this feast so boldly proclaims: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19). Go, says Jesus. Go, baptize, and teach.

How does anyone know whether their imagination is genuine, whether it is truly of God or an illusion? We find ourselves second-guessing our instincts because we also know that imagination by its nature can play tricks with reality. So we're not sure. We doubt. We are no different than the eleven disciples who journey to Galilee in search of Jesus. "When they saw him, they worshiped, but they doubted," is how Matthew's Gospel tells the story (28:17). That's how the mission of the Church was begun, in the midst of doubt.

It is amid such doubt that many ventures of great worth begin. Marriages can begin on the fringes of hesitant uncertainty, and yet, with conviction the couple also says "I do." Parents give birth to a child, all the while wondering whether they'll be able to live up to the task. Others reach for the stars shining in the nighttime skies of their dreams, unsure if they will succeed. To go out into a sometimes crazy world in order to live a Gospel of compassion and fair play and service to others is no less daunting. If we wait until we are assured success, we may never go.
