**Construction Update!**

Now that Franklin Art Glass has completed the installation of our new aluminum frames and repaired the existing stained-glass windows and replaced the outside protective glass, the Holy Cross Finance Committee and Diocese of Columbus has approved our next project. This project requires the replacement of the four old wooden dials and clock fixtures which have serious structural flaws. The cost of this project is approximately \$30,000.00 depending on how many days a special high-rise lift is needed. This project will be completed by the Verdin Company and it will start in 8-10 weeks.

**THE WORD**

Contemporary research suggests that religion is increasingly seen as personal choice. Spirituality has become a quest while church attendance and dogma are considered unimportant. Religious experience outweighs religious knowledge and creed, and denominational identities blur in the fog. Though all of this brings dismay to some, one positive aspect is that large numbers of people are intensely interested in spirituality. Unfortunately, that interest often lacks a communal dimension, and perfunctory religiosity holds little attraction for these spiritual seekers. Nevertheless, they are people who long to see God's presence in their world and in their lives, and they intently seek out those who can help them to recognize that God.

Curiously, none of this is far from the Gospel for today's feast of Saints Peter and Paul. It was Peter who was named Rock because he was able to recognize Jesus as the Messiah, as God made flesh, as the divine presence in their midst. It is upon such a grace that the Church was founded, and it is still that graced Rock that people seek today – the ability to point out to us the divine strands in the fabric of life. And when we find that gift, it is to those individuals that we instinctively give authority in our lives. That gift is what we look for in the pope and in bishops, in priests and parish ministers. It is what Jesus came to en flesh, and it is what today draws people to communities that are alive with faith.
