THE WORD

The poet Constantinos Cavafys offers a wonderful insight in his poem "Ithaca," whose title refers to the hometown Odysseus spends years journeying toward in The Odyssey. Ithaca stands for every destination for which we set out in our lives, every goal we try to achieve. Cavafys concludes that, while arriving there is your ultimate goal, Ithaca's greatest gift is the voyage she provokes you to take: "Without her you would never have set out on the road."

The God of the Bible is a God who invites people to journey. It begins with Abraham, then continues with Moses and the Israelites. Then there are the journeys the prophets take, like Elijah in today's reading, who is tired of being "on the road," but whom God sends an angel of the Lord to feed so he can be on his way again to the mountain where he will meet God. God is a God who calls us to journey, and while we are on the journey God provides food: manna in the desert, a hearth cake on the way to the mountains.

Sometimes the journey is a physical one, but not always. The Jews in today's Gospel are invited to take a journey of faith: to see Jesus not as the son of Joseph but as one who came down from heaven. But they resist. They don't want to go far from their "home," their comfort zone. To take this journey, they have to listen to the Father and learn that Jesus is indeed the Son, the living bread come down from heaven. And heaven knows where that will lead. Who knows what they will be given to eat?
