THE WORD

Many people have referred to their small town of birth as a “nickel-and-dime” town which doesn’t sound like a compliment. It appears this was similar to Micah’s words about Bethlehem as “too small to be among the clans of Judah” (5:1). Another description would be a “backwater.” Hardly a place deserving of great expectations. Yet, backwater Bethlehem, city of David the shepherd boy, was to be the birthplace of the Messiah – not Jerusalem, center of government and religion, city of David the warrior king.

God’s strange choices extend beyond geographical sites to the people on whom God sets eyes. A young betrothed girl up in the north, a barren woman down in the south – these were chosen to play pivotal roles in the story of salvation. The once-barren Elizabeth, soon to bring forth the greatest of all prophets, now proclaims God’s most marvelous work and the little one through whom God is working: “Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb” (Luke 1:42).

Elizabeth cues us to join in the response of the baby in her womb: to allow our hearts and spirits to leap for joy. Again and again, God works through those who are open to the Spirit. Blessed are they who place their trust in the Lord who continues to come to give us new life.
