Lenten Opportunities at Holy Cross

Every Friday: Stations of the Cross after 11:30 a.m. Mass [Sorrowful Mother Novena will resume on First Fridays after Easter]. Day of abstinence (no meat for those over 14 years of age).

Holy Thursday:

Mass of the Lord's Supper, 5:30 p.m.

Good Friday:

Day of fast and abstinence
 1:00 p.m. Stations of the Cross
 2:00 p.m. Good Friday Liturgy and Holy Communion

Holy Saturday:

8:30 p.m. Solemn Easter Vigil

***Fast = One main meal, 2 lesser meals, no food between meals, for 21-59 years. Abstinence = no meat for over 14 years old.**

THE WORD

The first reading today describes the new covenant that Jeremiah sees as the one effective answer to the human condition. What can be done, the prophet laments, when sinful behavior has become so crystallized by habit that reform seems impossible?

Jeremiah is not sanguine about humanity's ability to follow unaided the dictates of the law. In image after vivid image throughout his book, he has shown how set in their sinful ways the people have become. They seem to have lost all ability to change. Thus, he says, "Can the Ethiopian change his skin? /the leopard his spots? /As easily would you be able to do good, /accustomed to evil as you are" (13:23). Jeremiah calls the people evil, refusing to hear God's word and instead "walk[ing] in the stubbornness of their hearts" (13:10; cf. 18:12). It is this recalcitrance that causes God to mourn the "pernicious thoughts" within the people and to claim that their conversions are half-hearted (4:14; 3:10). Their heart remains "stubborn and rebellious" with the result that "they turn and go away" (5:23). The sorry state of the people's continued bad behavior leads Jeremiah to conclude: "More tortuous than all else is the human heart, /beyond remedy" (17:9).

Today's passage from the book of Jeremiah is God's response to this desperate state of affairs. God speaks of days that are coming in which God will give the people a new covenant unlike the one that they broke in the past. This covenant will be unbreakable because it will be written not on tablets of stone but rather on the hearts of the people. The image conveys a realignment of the orientation that so perverts their actions; they will be aligned now with God's orientation.

Today, we hear of the inner transformation that God can accomplish even when our dispositions themselves are our worst enemies.
