THE WORD

Most dioceses in the United States have moved the solemnity of the Ascension from Thursday to Sunday. Too many American Catholics were missing an important celebration in the Church year. Observing the feast forty days after Easter is not central to the celebration. Only Luke has Jesus ascending to heaven forty days after his resurrection. Matthew has an ascension but doesn't indicate when, only where: in Galilee; and John has Jesus ascending immediately on Easter Sunday after speaking to Mary Magdalene and before appearing to the apostles. Mark puts his ascension right on Easter Sunday night after he appears to the Eleven.

What is important for us and common to all four events is the point that the risen Lord sent out his disciples to preach the Gospel right before he ascended. In Mark's Gospel today we hear him say, "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." (Mark 15:15) I am reminded of those Westerns in which a wagon train is traveling across the country. Early each morning the cry would come, "Move on out!" Our annual celebration of the Ascension reminds us once again that we are called to "move on out."

The Ascension is an important part of the story of a new creation that begins with Jesus' death and resurrection. These events signaled a new era. The Ascension advances that story by telling us that Jesus ascended to the Father where he now intercedes for us. But not only that! As Mark reminds us in the final words of his Gospel, "they went forth and preached everywhere, while the Lord worked with them." (Mark 16:20) This presence of the Lord remains with us to this day when we proclaim the Gospel through our words and deeds.

So as Luke's angels said two millennia ago, "Why are you standing there looking at the sky?" (Acts 1:11) Move on out. There is work to be done.
