THE WORD

A famous actress once commented on her own record of multiple marriages that she certainly believed in the institution. Statistics show that more than fifty percent of marriages today end in divorce. A sociologist has called marriage in our day a “porous institution” that no longer holds people securely. But Jesus offers another vision.

Jesus takes a rather strict position on marriage in today’s Gospel. There were two schools of thought on marriage at that time. One allowed for divorce on almost any grounds; all a husband had to do was to sign a writ of divorce and his wife would have to leave his home. The other line of reasoning held that only for the most serious reason – adultery – was divorce allowed. Jesus Himself goes back to the first book of the Torah. God’s plan is that marriage is to be lasting; man and woman are to grow in unity.

We may not realize how much a woman could be victimized under the more liberal teaching. Jesus is coming down on the side of the woman here, that she, too, had rights and wasn’t merely under the control of her husband. But His teaching also addresses the possibility of a woman divorcing her husband and recognizes that the husband also has rights. Marriage is described as a holy relationship, designed by God.

In a similar fashion, children were also seen in that culture as having little value, possibly a defense mechanism against the prevalence of infant and child mortality. No matter; in Jesus’ eyes these little ones belong to the kingdom of God. Furthermore, we can learn from them to accept the kingdom with arms as open as a child’s when receiving an unexpected gift.

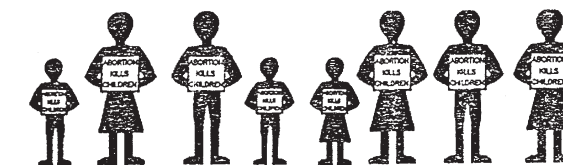
Special Parish Dates
